The Sherman County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, July 22, 2025, in the Boardroom of the Sherman County Courthouse with the following persons present: Tom Bandur-Chairman, Kenneth Kaslon-Vice Chairman and David Siegel. The Chairman called the meeting to order at 9:00a.m. Notice of the meeting was published in the Sherman County Times and given in advance to all members of the Board. - Joel Bergman-Sherman County Sheriff reviewed and discussed 60-6,190 with the Board, the power of local authority on establishing speed limits. Bergman stated the County Board has the power to alter speed limits on county highways which are not part of the state highway system with the change based on engineering and traffic investigation.
- Mitch Dzinlge-Noxious Weed Superintendent discussed the spraying of noxious weeds along the Middle Loup River using drones and air boats on infestations that do not have land access. Mr. Dzingle will be contacting the property owners.
- Donna Trompke and Rose Kowalski of the Sherman County Historical Society reviewed the Historical Society's insurance expenses which had a 20% increase, utility expenses, expenses paid by volunteers, the members donated time on projects and the grants the Historical Society received.

- Heidi Borg- Agricultural Liaison for Adrain Smith updated the Board on the work Congressman Smith has been doing with the Ways and Means Committee and on the Trade Committee.
